## Valedictory Function

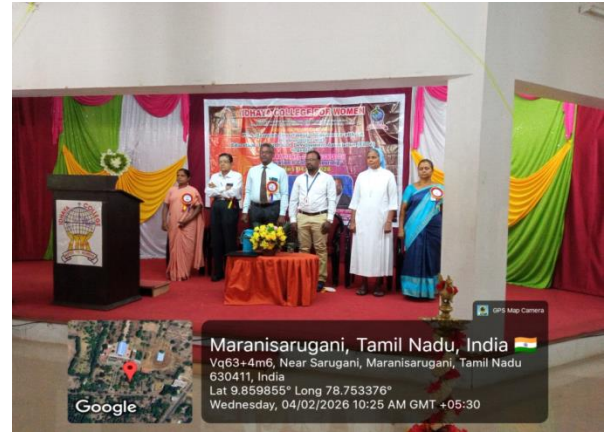
